16 ounces strawberries, hulled and halved 1/4 cup rice vinegar 1 tablespoon honey 8 cups arugula

1 cup basil leaves


Flaky salt 1 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes Freshly ground black pepper 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil


Directions

- 1. In a medium bowl, toss the strawberries, rice vinegar and honey to combine.
- 2. Arrange the arugula and basil leaves on a serving platter. Season with flaky salt and sprinkle with the crushed red pepper flakes. Spoon the berries and their juices over top, then drizzle with the olive oil. Season generously with freshly ground black pepper.





Bonnie's Bits Did You Know?

Your cat can help you be well!

Researchers studied and analyzed the purrs of 44 members of the cat family, including cheetahs, ocelots, pumas and domestic cats. Every one generated strong vibrational frequencies between 25 and 150 Hz. Their purr frequencies corresponded to the exact vibrational frequencies that have been found to successfully treat bone growth/fractures, pain, swelling, muscle strain, joint flexibility, difficulty breathing and wounds.




Domestic cats produced purr frequencies at exactly 25 Hz and 50 Hz. These are the two low frequencies that best promote bone growth and the healing of bone fractures. When they harmonize, their purr frequency is within 2 Hz of 100 Hz, the exact frequency used therapeutically for pain, swelling, wounds, and difficulty breathing.

Cat purring is a built-in vibrational mechanism for self-healing. It also helps explain why some people can stop migraine headaches by lying down with a purring cat next to their head, or soothe an aching joint through contact with a purring cat.

Vets say there is a big difference between cats and dogs. Complications from surgery are far more common in dogs and cancer and disease of the bone are rarely found in cats, but common in all breeds of dogs. We could and should be learning from the innate healing ability of cats. They may provide living proof of just how vital vibration can be in healing and health. To learn more, check out this study:
