
Be free of your fears and burdens, you've carried them long enough


















UPCOMING TRIPS

Baked Acorn Squash

2 Med. Accorn squash 1/4 c. honey 1/4 c. butter or margarine

1/2 tsp. salt
Dash of pepper

Halve the squash lengthwise. Scoop out seeds and pulp. Trim the bottoms so the squash will stand level. Blend together honey, butter, salt and pepper. Divide among the halves. Place the squash in a greased baking dish and cover tightly with foil. Bake in preheated 375 deg. Oven for 1 hours. Uncover and bake for 15 to 20 minutes longer, until lightly browned and soft, basting frequently with butter mixture.
