

Norwegian Apple Pie/Cake - Joyce Green

Ingredients: 5-6 applies sliced thin 1 tps each sugar & cinnamon ¾ c melted butter 1 c sugar

1 c flour 2 eggs 1 tsp vanilla ½ c walnuts



Directions:

You can use a pie plate or any small cake pan. Butter the pan. Slice up the apples and put them in the pan. Sprinkle with cinnamon and sugar. Mix together the melted butter, sugar, flour, eggs, vanilla, and nuts. Put it over the apples. Bake 45-60 minutes at 350 degrees or until toothpick comes out clean.





Medical Appointments: Available as needed


• Please note: If the appointment is for surgery, the client needs to find other transportation home. Van drivers cannot be responsible for a client after having any major medical procedures.
