


when the outhouse will fall through the ice!

Healing Cabbage Soup

My body craves this cabbage soup whenever I have a cold, but it's equally delicious on a cold winter's night. It's so easy to make; add extra vegetables, leftover chicken, or rice for a more substantial meal.

Ingredients

- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- ½ onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, chopped
- 2 quarts water
- 4 teaspoons chicken bouillon granules

1 teaspoon salt, or to taste

½ teaspoon black pepper, or to taste

½ head cabbage, cored and coarsely chopped

1 (14.5 ounce) can Italian-style stewed tomatoes, drained and diced

Directions

- 1. In a large stockpot, heat olive oil over medium heat. Stir in onion and garlic; cook until onion is transparent, about 5 minutes.
- 2. Stir in water, bouillon, salt, and pepper. Bring to a boil, then stir in cabbage. Simmer until cabbage wilts, about 10 minutes.
- 3. Stir in tomatoes. Return to a boil, then simmer 15 to 30 minutes, stirring often.
- 4. Serve hot and enjoy!

Medicare Advantage Open Enrollment Period

If you are in a Medicare Advantage plan on January 1st, you can again make a change to your Medicare health coverage. The Medicare Advantage Open Enrollment Period runs from January 1st through March 31st. This is especially important if your doctor no longer accepts your Medicare insurance in the new year.
