
Town Center Survey

1 Demographics

1.1 Response Rate

A total of 340 responses to the survey were received, this included 7 people who lived outside of Hubbardston, and 3 who were 17 years of age or younger. The response rate of the survey was approximately 10.5%, which exceeded our target response rate of 10%.¹


1.2 Where do you live?



¹. The response rate was calculated as the number of Hubbardston residents age over 18 years who completed the survey (330) divided by the number of registered voters in Hubbardston (3151).


1.3 How old are you?



1.4 Do you have any children under the age of 18?




1.5 Do you own a business in Hubbardston?




2.1 How often do you go to the Town Center and use the shops and services there?




2.2 How has the amount of times you go to the Town Center changed over the last couple of years?



2.3 How do you normally travel to the town center?



Speed, speed and speed for cars driving through town including police vehicles. Also the large trucks that pass through town cause noise and vibration pollution, especially when using their engine breaks. Speed recording devices should be utilized at both ends of the center of town, not just in front of the police station. Also, speed bumps at both ends of the center of town should be considered as a way to enforce slow down for all vehicles.

Condition of existing sidewalks is deplorable and forces pedestrians to walk on the side of the road.

speed is the biggest issue, with the police station right on Main st it should be easy for more tickets to be issued to force compliance to the posted speed limit

Alot of cars traveling through the area usually are speeding through.

My main complaint is the ridiculous lack of street lights

We live only a mile from town, yet we have to travel Williamsville Road to reach the center. I won't allow my children to walk this road because of the blind curves and absence of sidewalks, yet many children do this to get to the rec field. It is absolutely unsafe. If this road were improved, our access to town facilities would be greatly improved.

I would absolutely HATE seeing anything in Paul Hales plan. He does not represent most townspeople's ideals. Lamplights like Holden are NOT Hubbardston. The "safety" offices need to stay on Main Street, not way up on Gardner Road. You can call it town center, but that doesn't make it the center proper (that's one reason why your plans fail, fail and fail again) make a new Fire Station on the existing site, expand it by purchasing the Trembley property. Buy the church that is for sale and the house behind it for parking to use as town office/senior center. And fix the police station and stop with the bandage complaints about that building. All these could be accomplished for far less than the outrageous 7.5 mil price tag your "only new, all new, we deserve new, new expensive new" plan. YES updates need to be done, but do it in a Hubbardston way, not Westminster/Holden(again with the Holden-similarities!) way. The safety staff is supported, and it is so very sad that the administration does not understand that. I find it terrible that the same solution keeps getting rejected, but keeps coming back in an effort to force the poor not Hubbardston style plan on us.

The town looks terrible. Worn out and dirty. The rental properties are dragging the image down.

According to the last committee WPI has designed a new Main Street plan. This is to be done when the State resurfaces route 68. On the immediate corrections that can be made is to turn on the exsisting lites on Main Street again and get the police to do more radar especially during the school times.

We have noticed a major increase in the amount of tractor trailers ("dirt" carrying rather than box type) coming south on Route 68. Their attempt (not always successful) to slow down as they enter the center means loud braking noise which is not at all what the center needs. It is bad enough in the winter with windows closed..

To amplify on Brigham Rd/Main St. intersection, there are very poor sight lines when coming out of Brigham looking downhill (south). Also, as a driver and not a parent, I really think it is unsafe having all the parental cars jamming the main street as they pick up their children - really reduces visibility of a driver being able to see the kids before they dart out into the road. Good point about the lack of a sidewalk up to the Rec Field. Just as a side note, people (adults as well as kids) need to remember the rules of the road for both walking and cycling.

The entire road & the potholes on Elm St./Barre Rd. by the Elem. School are still horrendous!! That is not the way to install "speed bumps" by leaving the road in such bad condition, that no one can drive over 15 MPH. Half the time if someone is coming in the other direction, you end up driving on people's lawns because that road is SO bad.

Sidewalks would be great

I do not like hearing sirens. The police are using sirens more than they used to.

Lack of visibility in front of school during drop off and pick up. Too many cars on side of road. Can't see coming off of elm street onto main street

Police do a fantastic job with speed through Main Street. Main concern is 68 North from GFA to Rec Field and no sidewalk.

Coming off of Brigham Street to the center of town is extremely concerning to me, as it seems to drivers approaching the center from Rutland area are not aware, not prepared for, as they do not see cars coming out of Brigham St and do not have enough time to slow down.

Barre road needs at least one sidewalk on the road like to walk or run and it is NOT safe at all!

Most activities at the rec field are under the some sort of supervision, with the exception of the skate park. This leaves open the opportunity to attract local and out of youth of all ages or adults and has the potential to create safety issues for abutting neighbors and young children.

ADA access to public bathroom facility.

What concerns me the most is the inadequate parking space for the school. Having to park on both sides of Main Street is dangerous. It's hazardous for the kids and for those trying to access their cars on very heavily traveled state road.

Bemis Road -The beginning is too narrow and the standing dead trees should be removed. Old Westminster road has craters-potholes. Needs repaving. Many roads need repaving. I've been here for 32 years and I do not see the back roads maintained.

Mr. Mike's presents a constant safety & visibility hazard. Parking should not be allowed anywhere alongside the building where it abuts Route 68.

Parking along Route 68 in front of school, library, and post office should be prohibited AT ALL TIMES & some other parking options/arrangements or shuttle service be employed for parents picking up children after school. This is radical but how about a speed bump before Elm Street/Brigham Rd. intersection to slow traffic traveling

north from Rutland/Holden on Worcester Rd? Bad visibility there as you know.

Would like to see town message board used for safety messages such as WIPERS ON LIGHTS ON & also take old messages down asap since they are an unnecessary distraction. (Personally I think the message board is unsightly anyway.)

I worry about safety of teens, there is no place for them really go. If they go to playground people don't like it, they can't hang at the stores, the rec field is limited unless they are skateboarding, or playing soccer. There are a few basketball hoops at the school, but not much else.

Times have changed since I was a teen, so I understand concerns about kids hanging out. There were not so many restrictions, ie; we could go to little store, get a soda, sit and talk and listen to music. We could go the school, ride bikes, play basketball or rollerskate. Teens seem to get into trouble because there is no place to go without being kicked out.











Utilize community preservation funds to improve and historically preserve the Town Center buildings, sidewalks and homes. We should invest in our Town Center to enhance our two anchor historic assets, the Unitarian Church and the Public Library. The Town Center is the gateway to the community and serves to define our entire Town.

Respondents living within 1 mile of the Town Center

We need a new fire station and police dept.

Parking is biggest problem. Slade Bldg. is a money pit. Library needs more space. Town offices should be under one roof. Fire station rent (Breezy Hills) should cease (too bad Town didn't purchase....) Senior Center is inadequate. Turn Slade Bldg. into parking lot, build a Municipal Complex to house Public Safety, Town Offices, Senior Center/Community Space. Pallet Business is huge eye-sore and contributes nothing to the town, visually or economically.

Our tax base is over 90% residential. Therefore, when the budget goes up each year, most of the share comes from residents. By introducing more sustainable businesses, we can rebalance the tax base and share the costs of our town.

Please keep the town center in the center of the town. Keep the school, post office, town offices, senior center walkable within the town center!

The septic issue has come up more than once --- the hardship of paying for this is not something that should be placed on those who live on Main Street. Although the town center has an overly district for commercial --- it is first

a residential area and should remain that way -- residential.
