I'm happy to provide this latest update on happenings around Town Hall and initiatives underway. As always, if you have any questions or need more details, please let me know.

I'm continuing work on the **five-year budget forecast**, implementing new components to help project further based on historical data and key performance indicators we've established. Building year-to-year continuity is crucial, so I'm focused on linking each budget document into a cohesive long-term financial plan.

Capital requests were submitted to the **Capital Improvement Planning Committee** last week, and I look forward to reviewing priorities in depth at our upcoming meeting in early December.

On the project front, the **DPW roof replacement** is entering its final phases and is on track for completion this week. We are also accepting sealed bids for the **Hubbardston Center School boiler replacement project** until December 21st. Upgrading the school's heating system will provide more reliable and energy efficient operations.

Last week I attended the **Massachusetts Municipal Managers Association conference** in Worcester. The sessions were informative, particularly the one on promoting civility at public meetings. Equally valuable was connecting with colleagues across the state and sharing best practices. I'm energized with new techniques to try here in Hubbardston.

We've invited residents to a **Rural Priorities Roundtable** on November 27 with Anne Gobi, Director of Rural Affairs. This event will allow residents to share perspectives to help inform decisions tailored specifically to rural needs. Community input is critical as we plan for the future.

I'm also excited to launch "Coffee and Community Conversations," a monthly informal coffee chat series at the Stars and Stripes Diner. Beginning next week, I'll be there on the last Tuesday morning of each month through April. These casual conversations allow me to hear residents' concerns, answer questions, and gather feedback. I welcome every opportunity to actively engage with the community.

Earlier this month, we held a staff meeting to align on budgets, upcoming holidays, financial policies and more. Keeping staff focused on key initiatives helps us provide the highest quality service.

DPW Update

Over the last few weeks, the DPW has been busy preparing for winter and conducting regular maintenance activities. We have cleaned up leaves in the cemeteries, continued brush mowing on Simonds Hill Rd. and Twin Hill Rd., and patched potholes on several roads. We brought snow removal equipment up to the Slade building and installed plows on all vehicles. Some specific maintenance tasks included blowing out washouts on Twin Hill Rd., fixing a dirt section on Adams Rd., removing AC units from town offices, and rustproofing trucks. We also held a snow and ice training refresher class for the whole crew. As winter weather arrived, we treated the roads for slippery conditions during a snow squall. In addition to winter prep, we have been inspecting equipment, making sand/salt mix, replacing truck parts, washing trucks, and diagnosing any mechanical issues. e.

Veterans Services

Lauren Wright, Hubbardston's Veteran Service Officer, attended the unveiling of the new HERO Act, the largest veteran's legislation passed in Massachusetts in 20 years. Governor Maura Healey, Lt. Governor Kim Driscoll, and Secretary of Veterans' Services Jon Santiago announced the act in Braintree on November 9, 2023. The HERO Act proposes 17 initiatives to increase benefits, promote inclusivity, and modernize services for Massachusetts veterans. Key provisions include increasing cash bonuses for disabled veterans and Gold



Star families, expanding healthcare and prosthetic coverage, creating tax breaks for veteran-owned businesses, establishing a woman veteran coordinator position, requiring public colleges to have veteran resource centers, and updating definitions to be more inclusive. "I was honored to attend the unveiling of this groundbreaking legislation and hear directly from our state leaders about their commitments to supporting veterans of all backgrounds," said Wright. "The HERO Act will make meaningful improvements to veterans' lives by increasing access to benefits, healthcare, housing, education and employment. I look forward to helping Hubbardston veterans take full advantage of the new opportunities this act will provide." Wright thanked the legislative delegation for their leadership on behalf of Massachusetts veterans.
