

TOWN ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

August 3, 2023 - As we approach the end of summer, I am writing to update you on the important work we have been doing to prepare for the upcoming busy seasons and ensure the continued success of our town.

In July, the Select Board held its annual goal retreat, during which we discussed crucial objectives for the coming year. Since then, I have worked closely with department heads to develop specific action plans aligning with these goals. I am excited to present these plans to the Select Board on August 7, 2023, and I am confident they will guide us toward a productive and prosperous year ahead.

Additionally, I have been diligently analyzing data and writing the financial obligations assessment. This comprehensive overview of our financial situation will be presented to the Select Board on the same date, August 7. It will help us identify potential risks and challenges, enabling us to make informed decisions for the betterment of our community.

I have begun collaborating with department heads to develop a streamlined budget and CIP process for the upcoming fiscal year. Furthermore, we have been actively seeking opportunities to enhance efficiency and provide training for our dedicated staff. Through careful assessment, we have begun identifying areas where process improvements can lead to cost savings, and we are developing tailored training programs to enhance their skills and knowledge further.

Executive Assistant Toni Walker has taken on the crucial task of reviewing all past and present contracts. Her meticulous work will give us a comprehensive understanding of our existing agreements and their expiration dates. This information will be organized and documented systematically on the Laserfiche platform, streamlining our contract management process and enhancing our efficiency and preparedness for future contractual matters.

In late July, we held our bi-monthly department meeting, discussing ways to better work with Town Accountant Pontbriand to track department budgets effectively. By setting up regular meetings with her to review budgets and gain feedback, we aim to use taxpayer money wisely and improve our budget tracking methods.

I want to express my gratitude for the Select Board's continued support and our hardworking staff's dedication. We will ensure a successful and productive year, benefiting the entire community.

HUBBARDSTON FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Hubbardston Fire Department responded to 75 calls for service in July, including a structure fire, 39 medical emergencies, 15 alarm activations, ten service calls, four motor vehicle accidents, two electrical emergencies, one water rescue, one smoke investigation, one search for a missing person, and one mutual aid cover assignment. This brings the total number of calls for service to date to 463.

The department also conducted numerous inspections and held multiple training sessions in July. These efforts are part of the department's commitment to providing the highest level of service to the residents of Hubbardston.





Pitcherville Road Paving Project

The paving project on Pitcherville Road commenced on Monday, July 31, 2023, at 7:00 am. The project was expected to take one week to complete. During the project, there were delays on Pitcherville Rd. Drivers were advised to prepare for delays and to consider alternative routes. The project then shifted to Birches Rd. (paved section) and subsequently to Cross Rd. (between Ragged Hill Rd. and New Templeton Rd.)

Meetings and Discussions

Policy Review Working Group: The Policy Review Working Group met in early August and made significant progress in its mission to review and update the organization's policies. The group reviewed the goals and objectives for the working group, as well as the new draft credit card policy and digital document storage policy. The group also discussed the timeline for the comprehensive review of the personnel policies. The group will meet again in late August to begin the comprehensive review of the personnel policies.

Rural School Legislation: I attended a virtual briefing on July 20th at 10 am to learn more about H3567/S2388, a bill providing sustainable funding for rural schools. The bill addresses several issues that affect all school districts, including special education, transportation, shared services, and regionalization. This bill will be a step in the right direction for rural schools, and I hope it will be passed into law.

MEMA Introductions: Our new MEMA Representative, Ray Ferrin, met with Judie O'Donnell and me on August 3rd, 2023, to discuss emergency planning and preparation in Hubbardston. The meeting was productive, and Ray agreed to work with us to develop a comprehensive emergency plan and provide training on emergency preparedness and response.

Municipal Choice Aggregation: Francois Steiger and I met with several consultants to discuss municipal choice aggregation. We were pleased with the information we received and are now meeting to discuss which option seems best for Hubbardston. This initiative can save Hubbardston residents and businesses money on energy bills. Still, we want to ensure we choose the right option for the community. Due to a backlog at the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs (EOEEA), this project will likely take a few years. Still, we are committed to seeing it through.

Public Safety Building Committee: The Public Safety Building Committee is taking "field trips" to different Public Safety Facilities to gain valuable information on our wants and needs. The Committee is interested in learning about the latest technologies and innovations in efficient modular public safety facilities and seeing how other communities have designed their facilities to meet the needs of their law enforcement and fire departments. This information will be essential in helping us to design a new public safety facility that meets the needs of Hubbardston for the next 50 years. The Committee will likely use the allocated ARPA funds to conduct a feasibility study on the need and price for shovel-ready documents. This study will help us determine the feasibility of a new public safety facility and develop a project budget. I am collecting several of these studies from my colleagues in other municipalities, which will help inform our study. I am confident that the Public Safety Building Committee is progressing well in planning a new public safety facility. We are committed to working with the community to design a facility that meets their needs.

Regional Trash Possibilities: I have begun discussions with Rutland and Princeton to explore regional trash and recycling options that would be cost savings for residents and better for the environment. Our current system cannot offer a pay-as-you-throw option or easily recycle certain materials, so that a regional program could address these challenges. I will keep you updated on the progress of this initiative.


