TOWN ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

SEPTEMBER 5, 2023

August 31, 2023 - As the warm summer days give way to crisp autumn air, activity in Hubbardston is ramping up. There are many exciting projects and initiatives underway that aim to enhance the community.

Conversations continue around the transformative Town Center Project that promises to revitalize the heart of Hubbardston. I recently joined Superintendent Mucha, Director Clark, Principal Cook, and Commissioner Lancini on an informative walkthrough of Hubbardston Center School. We assessed capital needs such as parking lot upgrades, water infrastructure improvements, and generator enhancements to boost sustainability and emergency preparedness. Ensuring these important projects are included in the Capital Improvement Plan will allow us to be proactive and strategic with resources.

Board and Committee members should mark your calendars for the Fall 2023 Board & Committee Summit on September 14th at 6pm at the Senior Center. This is a valuable opportunity for boards to share progress on current projects and initiatives. We'll also have important presentations on Open Meeting Law and board expectations and posting requirements. Please send representatives from your board or committee, and RSVP by September 4th. Connecting with one another fosters collaboration and unified vision.

We've launched the Community Choice Capital Program to get input on how capital improvement funds should be used over the next 5 years. Propose projects like park upgrades, road repairs, and infrastructure improvements by submitting your ideas through a Google Form by November 1st. Or attend Capital Improvement Planning Committee meetings to provide direct feedback. Your proposals will be reviewed for feasibility and community-wide benefit. This participatory program gives Hubbardston residents a greater voice in determining priorities for the future.

As summer transitions to fall, our work continues to enhance Hubbardston's quality of life. Please reach out with any questions or suggestions - I look forward to our continued collaboration and community engagement as we shape the bright future of Hubbardston.

Hubbardston Fire Dept



As of the end of August, the Hubbardston Fire Department has reached the two-thirds mark for calendar year 2023. Thus far, the department has responded to a total of 526 calls for service, including 61 calls in August alone. By comparison, the total number of responses for the full 2010 calendar year was 498. With four months remaining in 2022, the Hubbardston Fire Department is poised to exceed last year's record call volume and experience the busiest year in its history.

In accordance with the Hubbardston Charter, the Town Administrator maintains a comprehensive inventory of all town property, including real estate and other assets. As outlined in the charter, bylaws, and other directives, the Town Administrator oversees the maintenance and repair of all town property under their supervision. To comply with the charter and optimize insurance coverage, maintenance expenses, and purchasing practices, the Town Administrator thoroughly audits the entire town inventory at the start of each fiscal year.

The last complete inventory and audit of Hubbardston's town property was conducted in 2019. As of September 2023, Town Administrator Nathan Boudreau has updated the town webpage to include a complete inventory and records on all town property, assets, and real estate. When emergencies occur, notifications through Rutland Regional Alerts can provide life-saving information about the actions you need to take.
