Question 1

Shall the Town of Hubbardston be allowed to exempt from the provisions of Proposition two-and-one-half, so called, the amounts required to pay for the bonds issued in order to repair and replace the Hubbardston Center School Roof located at 8 Elm Street?

SUMMARY: Pursuant to Massachusetts General Law Chapter 59, Section 21C, known as Proposition 2-1/2, the Town is limited in the amount of money it may raise through property taxes each year. The law provides further, however, that the voters may authorize an increase in the amount to be raised by taxation. Approval of this question will allow the Town to raise by taxation, outside of the limits of Proposition 2-1/2, the costs to pay for repairing and replacing the Hubbardston Center School Roof, including the cost of debt service associated with borrowing the funds for this purpose. The additional taxing authority is available to pay for the cost of borrowing the sum necessary to complete the project, beginning July 1, 2020. The question of whether to raise the funds by taxation and appropriate them for this purpose will be considered by the voters at the June 23, 2020 Annual Town Meeting.

A YES vote would authorize the Town to raise by taxation, in addition to the amount permitted to be raised pursuant to Proposition 2-1/2, the amount needed to pay for the repairs and replacement of the Center School Roof plus the cost of debt service.

A NO vote would make no change in the limitations imposed by Proposition 2-1/2 with regard to the amount the Town may raise by taxation.
